This can lead to demotivation and a loss of confidence in the system. In light of the above, I strongly urge the National Human Rights Commission to take action against this illegal practice. The authorities should conduct rigorous investigations to identify and punish the culprits involved in selling exam papers. Measures should also be taken to ensure the confidentiality of the question papers and prevent their leakage. Only through these actions can we guarantee a fair and transparent recruitment process and protect the human rights of the genuine candidates. And lastly, Hon'ble Commission is prayed to direct Government of Arunachal Pradesh to provide monetary compensation to all the deprived candidates as a partial solution to this problem. While it may provide some redressal to the affected candidates, it does not address the root cause of the issue.
